TRASHY BUSINESS

Most of the questions handled by Joe, Joe and Mike were about future changes in city trash collection. Fees for trash collection will appear on the next water bill. (You may have received it by now.) If you occupy a 2-family building by yourself and do not rent out the other unit, you do not have to pay the fee for that empty flat. The office of Collector of Revenue Gregory Daly is the place to contact if you could be overcharged. Blue "single stream" dumpsters will arrive in our alleys one per block, perhaps in the spring. The city will need to obtain new trucks to collect from them. Not all wards will get recycling dumpsters, and not all will get them at the same time. The lids can be unlocked only by the collector so that it will be difficult to dump in ordinary trash. Alderman Vollmer said it is hoped that in the future more trash dumpsters can be replaced with recycling dumpsters. If you already have noticed a blue dumpster in your alley near an apartment or business, note that such dumpsters contracted privately must be on private property, not in the alley; call the Citizens Service Bureau to report it. Wow, that's enough trash talk.
