When reporting nuisance behavior, be sure to give the address of the property you are complaining about, not your own. Be specific about the behavior, too.

ANNETTE'S WALKING THE ALLEYS

23rd Ward NSO Annette Bridges said she often patrols alleys looking for ordinance violations. She and **Alderman Joe Vaccaro** are concerned changes in laws related to scrap metal purchase may not solve the thefts, **so continue your vigilance and call the police.**

WARD BOUNDARIES

Despite redistricting, ward boundaries in our neighborhood **have not changed**. If you live south of Pernod and west of Brannon, your alderman is Joe Vaccaro, and you live in the 23rd Ward. Otherwise, your alderman is Joe Vollmer, and you live in the 10th Ward.

POLICE ...It is not "bothering" the police to call them. 911 and 231-1212 go to the same dispatchers. If you are not sure you have an emergency, let them sort it out.

PREACHIN' TO THE CHOIR

A member at the September meeting requested we remind everyone to use the blue recycling bins correctly. Most neighbors who have asked to receive this newsletter this month already do. Separate your recyclables and non-recyclables before you head out to the alley. Remind any workmen in or around your home the alley dumpsters are for our household use only, not construction materials.
